Getting to Roehampton

Train

The nearest station is Barnes, from which it is about 15 minutes' walk from the Main Site Campus, or take bus 72 or 265, which stop outside all campuses (Roehampton University/Main Entrance, or Queen Mary's Hospital for a stop closer to Grove House).

Trains to Barnes run from Clapham Junction, London Waterloo, Staines and Windsor

Tube

District/Piccadilly/Hammersmith & City lines to Hammersmith. From the tube station, go to bus stop K in the Lower Bus Station next to the shopping centre and take bus 72.

District line to Putney Bridge. From outside the tube station, take bus 265.
